6. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mrs Barbara Harvey, NZPCA President, welcomed everyone to the 58th Annual Conference and thanked the Manawatu West Coast Area Pony Club for hosting the 2004 Conference. A minutes' silence was taken to remember those people who had lost loved ones during the past year.

She thanked the Clubs who nominated her and those which had invited her to functions and rallies. She especially enjoyed attending rallies and talking to the riders and hoped that she would be able to attend more during the next season.

The President indicated she was not going to read her written report but encouraged all delegates to read the entire annual report, as it contained lots of information and plenty of food for thought. Her verbal report was centring on Membership which is a key issue in most Clubs and Branches. "Membership declined 333 across NZ during the past twelve months. Statistics have shown there are a number of reasons why members leave Pony Club ranging from being dissatisfied with what is happening in to being attracted to another activity that is being offered today. If we want to increase our members then we have to be open to change, 50 years ago PC was an all day affair. Today rallies vary from 1 to 2 hours. It is perceived that we are losing our older riders and an indication of this is the lack of full fields at our National Horse Trials and Dressage Championships Yet at the Springston Trophy and Timberlands events there are plenty coping at the level. Why aren't they coming through and competing at Area Trials?

Congratulations to Ashburton PC who had the single biggest increase of twenty-one members during the past twelve months. They were followed by Bream Bay/Kapara, Manukau City District with fourteen then Pointways, Matamata and Golden Bay PC's. Well done to all of you.

The NZPCA again provided a number of national events and competitions namely Zone Games, Dressage and Horse Trials. The Dressage Championships held in January was the first time all our teams competed at the one venue and incorporated an international derby with riders coming from Ireland, Britain, South Africa, Australia, Canada, Hong Kong and USA. A first for Pony Club in the world and the result of years of planning from the Dressage committee. Games also had a first with the North Island teams event with an invitation team from the South Island and Australia, and the Cook Strait crossing fund had an enormous increase after the Waikato Horse Trials. Many thanks to all the organisers of these events.

Our website has undergone a review and is a key channel of disseminating information. Pony Club is in good heart but we do need to need to increase our membership.'

The Presidents full report is included in the 58th Annual Report.

- A revamp of the Association's website was concluded.
- The finance committee have continued to exercise good management of the Association's resources.

13. PRESENTATION OF 2004 YOUNG ACHIEVER AWARDS

Pony Club Achievers Awards were presented by Mr Ian McKelvie – Six applicants were selected from 16 nominations representing 11 Pony Club Areas. The successful applicants, except Kirstin, who was present to receive her award, (through their Area Delegates) were presented with an 'Achievers Award' Certificate and a Cap especially commissioned for the achievers by the Mayor. This year the selection decided to acknowledge and recognise two additional applicants with a certificate of merit. The successful applicants were:

Chloe Davidson (16) Maunu Branch of the Whangarei Pony Club, Northland area.

Chloe is sixteen and attends Whangarei Girls High School. She has received an award for math's, has her level 1 NCEA, participates in school stage challenges where she has leading rolls, cross country running, youth groups and other school activities. Chloe has been a pony club member for seven years, has her C+ certificate, and has represented her Branch, Club and Area in Dressage, Horse Trials and Show Jumping. At Branch level she coaches young and adult riders, judges at ribbon days, and is very willing to help other riders or assist with pony club tasks. Over the last few years Chloe has had great success and has been awarded the schools most outstanding Equestrian for 2002/03, top Northland Equestrian, and Sport Spirit award 2003. Chloe's achievement encumbers both the NZPCA and NZEF. For the NZPCA she has represented Northland in the Dressage and Horse Trials championships and Timberlands. She won the D.C H.T champion and winning team in 2002. NZEF she has been in the Dressage World Cup challenge 2002/03, Ford NZEF Eventing talent squad 2003/04 and many more Dressage and Eventing championship wins and placing. Her Instructor has described her as a 'sponge' because she is so keen to soak up any knowledge that will assist in improving her riding and understanding of horsemastership. Chloe is very dedicated and manages to ride 2 horses, train another, as well as meeting all her school and family commitments.

Kirstin Gill (17) Makara Branch of the Wellington Pony Club, Wellington/Wairarapa Area.

Kirstin is currently in the 7th form at St Mary's College, has won the College Award for hard work and effort, Captain of the school Bowls team, organiser and senior member of the school Equestrian team, class leader, and helps as a chaperone to junior school functions. She also works after school. Kirstin has been in Pony Club for 12 years and has her B certificate. In the latter years she has been very involved in assisting with the design and building of her branch cross country course, fund raising working bees and instructing junior and intermediate riders. On the wider front she has represented her Area at the Horse Trials champs 2004 where she finished 11th overall, Games championships 2004, captain of the Makara Magic's' games team which finishes 2nd and won the Fair Play Award. Kirstin has also represented her club at Cambridge show jumping 2002/03 and Dressage trial 2001/02, and has been placed in numerous NZEF and A&P shows. Her DC writes that she is a very talented rider who has a real feel for her horse. Despite all her success she is always the same down to earth, polite, helpful and cheerful girl, who is great with younger riders. Recently Kirstin featured in the Sportz News which helped to raise the profile of pony club in the Wellington region.

Hannah Gloyn. (19) Te Kawai Branch of the Rangitikei Pony Club, Manawatu West Coast Area.

Hannah attended Nga Tawa School. During her time there she represented her school with honours in netball, hockey, and equestrian. She was also a member of the Young Enterprise Scheme that won the Regional final. Since leaving school Hannah attends Massey University where she was awarded a three-year Sporting Scholarship. Hannah was nominated as the Equestrian Youth Representative for the Athens Olympics. Hannah has been a Pony Club member for most of her life, as she has followed the family tradition where they are all fully involved in every aspect of the Pony Club movement. She has her B certificate. Hannah has represented her Club and Area in Dressage, Horse Trials and Show Jumping, winning the DC dressage at the horse trials championships in 2002, A1 dressage and 1st overall in 2003. In addition she has been in the NZEF ID Eventing squad 2002/03 and is on the short list for the Young Rider team, to compete in Australia 2004. Hannah's DC writes that she is a very natural leader and while fiercely competitive she has an exceptional way with helping and dealing with less able riders, and we will all be richer for her superb efforts.

Sally Newcombe (20) Carterton Branch of the South Wairarapa Pony Club, Wellington/Wairarapa Area.

While at Wairarapa College Masterton Sally gained an A bursary and a scholarship in Geography. She is currently in her 3rd year of a Commerce degree at Victoria University studying Accounting, Marketing and Commercial law. She plays netball for the University and a senior Wellington team. At school she was very successful in orienteering, dragon boating and cross-country. She was a school prefect, in the debating and speech teams and has her St John's emergence first aid certificate; level 2. Sally has been a Pony Club member for 10 years, she holds her H and O Gold certificate and is keen to sit her A. At school she was a member of the Equestrian team and was awarded a Sports

Blue for 4 years. Sally attends Pony Club as a rider, an instructor at rallies, camps, and treks; she has D Eqvalan Instructors certificate. Sally is a very useful member of her Pony Club assisting with all tasks from fence painting to gear checking and also writes and helps with NZEF dressage. At club and area level Sally has represented them in Games, Horse Trials and Dressage. She has also won an award for her outstanding contribution to the Welsh Pony and Cob Society. Sally's DC writes that with effort and determination every task she takes on are accomplished with excellence and perfection. She has exceptional knowledge of the theory side of all her subjects, and is always helpful and willing to do any task at Pony Club.

Gina Rothery. (19) Kawhia Branch of the Otorohanga Club, Waikato Area.

At school Gina was a House Captain in her 7th form year, Yellow Ribbon Ambassador, Junior Sportsperson nominee for Otorohanga 2003 and Spirit of New Zealand two times. Gina is now in her second year as a Law student at Waikato University. She is funding her University studies by breaking in and schooling several young ponies throughout the year. Gina has been in Pony Club for 13 years, and she holds her A and H certificate, receiving honours for her H. At branch level she is Rally Organiser as well as Head Instructor, always encourages, and helps members to sit their certificates. Gina has completed her Eqvalan D Instructors certificate and has commenced her C. At Area level she attended the Horse Trials championships in 2002, and has had considerable success at her local Area Trials in the last 2 years. Competed at Timberlands event for 3 years. Her DC writes that she is a wonderful role model for younger members, makes the rallies fun but always places the emphasis on rider's safety and horses health and well being. She leads by example and has a strong sense of fair play.

Erin Sinclair. (16) Pleasant Point Branch of South Canterbury Pony Club, Ashburton/South Canterbury/North Otago Area.

Erin's scholastic and sporting achievements at school are of a very high standard. She was 1st in her school with her NCEA levels, House captain, Head of her form, with awards in scholastic subjects. She is a member of the school, rugby, soccer, basketball and ski teams, diving and athletic champion 2003/4, and has received a Citizens Award for 4 years. Erin has been a member of Pony Club for 7 years, has her B HM and is working towards her B riding. She has her D Eqvalan certificate and instructs up to C level, assists with organisation and running of local events, branch team member in Dressage and Horse Trials for many years. However, it is in Dressage that she has excelled, been placed 1st in the South Island junior Dressage Championship in 2003 and 6th in NZ senior at Taupo 2004. Erin has also performed very well at NZEF Dressage events, and was in their talent squad for two years, she has also had considerable success at A&P shows for riding and paced and mannered classes. Her DC writes that she is a very high achiever, and although she has achieved considerable success she remains a great Pony Club member. The type of rider that the NZPCA is trying to promote with this award.

Certificates of Merit were awarded to:

Jenny Redditt (20) Tapanui Branch of the Eastern Southland Pony Club, Otago/Southland Area.

Jenny trained as a veterinary nurse at the Southland Institute of Technology where she gained the Muriel Medal for excellence; she also has a certificate in Rural Animal Technology from Otago Polytechnic. She works for PGG at Tapanui, and plays netball. Jenny has been a Pony Club member for 13 years and she holds her B certificate. She is a senior rider at her branch, does help with instructing, and course building. For one year was a grading officer for Eastern Southland. Jenny is a very competent rider of Dressage and Horse Trials, has represented her Area at the Dressage Zone finals for the last two years on two different horses, and has had success in NZEF Dressage competitions. Last year she competed in open and PC area trials. Her DC writes that Jenny was born without a left hand and has shown amazing courage and dedication to achieve her equestrian and other sporting success.

Mary Heberd, (17) Nelson City Branch of the Nelson Pony Club Marlborough/Nelson/Westland Area

Mary is unable to play sport at school but she has very high achievements in scholastic subjects, and has excellent results in Trinity College Speech and Drama, where she competes at festivals. She has also published Poetry work. Mary has been a Pony Club member for 6 years, has her C certificate and is hoping to sit her C+. She has a secondary school coaching certificate level 1 in Equestrian and instructs children for D certificate. Mary competes in all Pony Club events, and is a graded Para Equestrian rider, who is in the Para Equestrian Olympic development training squad. She is to represent NZ in Australia this year. Her DC writes that she displays a great deal of perseverance, never gives up and always gives her best, and that she is an inspiration to all Pony Club riders.

15. HORSE TRIALS REVIEW COMMITTEE – DISCUSSION PAPER

On Sunday morning, the HT Review Committee of Anne Cann (Convenor), Keith Bennett, Marj Steiner and Allan Ferguson presented a discussion paper with a number of options on key issues the Committee of Management believes needs resolving. The discussion was interactive. It was agreed that a period of four weeks be allowed, ie. up to Friday 30th July, for written submissions to be received from Clubs. Conference Delegates and Area Delegates to inform Clubs of the period for written submissions.

16. NEW COACHING STRATEGY - OVERVIEW

On Sunday morning, Gill Kingsbury, NZPCA Training Chairperson and Keith Scarlett presented the delegates with an overview of the new coaching strategy. Keith delivered a power point presentation on the key points with Gill facilitating a question and answer session following the presentation. A summary of the key points are as follows:

Structure

- Six zones – 3 North Island and 3 South Island

New Strategy

- Rider Courses - Horse Management and Riding (D to C+)
- Regional Courses (Inter Club) - D to C+ Coaches;
- National Courses (Inter Area) - B to A Coaches; Discipline Coaching; Upskilling Officials

Annual Planning

- Area Committee – Area Delegates to COM
- Application period – 1 June to 30 September; Application on official form to COM
- Application Approval – February COM meeting

Funding

- Association financial year (1 Mar to 28 Feb)
- Formula –Base factor & square area and Riding Members factor
- Sponsorship, Course Fees, Grants
- Non Completion of Courses

Summary

- Determining own needs for each Area
- Decentralisation of courses from Committee of Management to Areas
- Greater Flexibility for Areas to choose their courses

17. CONSTITUTIONAL REMITS

(i) Committee of Management

Mrs Heather Truman moved and Mrs Marj Steiner seconded the motion: that Rule 2:8 (d) Membership (Club and Branch Rules 2000 updated June 2003) be altered to read:

'It is a requirement of the Association that membership details be furnished as at 31st December each year, and membership subscriptions to the Association based on these figures are paid by the Club by 31st January following'.

18. CLUB FORUM DISCUSSION TOPICS

(i) Warkworth District Pony Club

That the current guidelines for all training levels (& below) ODE's to be adopted as rules.

COM will NOT discuss further.

(ii) Franklin District Pony Club

Games teams to be altered to include an elite and pre-elite level.

COM will NOT discuss further.

(iii) Tauranga Pony Club

That the NZPCA put in place a disciplinary procedure that is fair, honest and open and which incorporates the right of representation and an appeals procedure. Details of these procedures to be accessible to all Pony Club members.

COM will discuss further.

(iv) Waimarino Pony Club

That our members may wear stocks in Pony Club competitions.

COM will discuss further.

(v) Franklin District Pony Club

That the new 'O' fence in horse trials carries more than a 3 point penalty – at least the same as a rail (4).
