2012 NZPCA Show Jumping Style Prize sponsored by Quality Presentations Ltd

The purpose of the NZPCA Style prize is to raise the standard of riding and training by encouraging, recognizing and rewarding elite performances.

Performances where riders demonstrate correct and elegant positions, secure lower legs, flat backs, effective eye control and smooth, supple contact. Throughout the selected rounds competitors will ride smooth correct tracks, demonstrate calm, regular control of stride to produce pleasing and efficient results. The selected rounds may not be the winning rounds if faults are not judged to be caused by the riders.

- One class from each age group will be judged on the first day of competition.
- Judging will occur on the first round only of the selected classes (not the jump off).
- The winner of each class will be awarded a rosette sponsored by Quality Presentations Ltd.
- The judge's score sheets with comments of the top six riders will be posted after the selected classes.

The Rules

- 1) To be a Branch (or Clubs without Branches) Team event consisting of six riders, two in each age group, with a minimum of four riders in each team.
- 2) The age groups are to be —
Senior: 17 years and up to the end of the season they reach 21 years
Intermediate: 14 years and under 17 years
Junior: 13 years and under
Age as of first day of competition for all groups except for Senior's where they are able to compete up to the end of the season they reach the age of 21. The season being from the 1st August until the 31st July the following year.
- 3) Ponies and Hacks may be entered in any age group.
- 4) The approximate heights for the 1st round in each group will be:
Senior: 105 cms
Intermediate: 95 cms
Junior: 85 cms
Speed: 300 metres per minute. (It will be recommended that the heights be not greatly raised for jump-offs).
- 5) Four classes in each group count for the Championship. 1st Day, TAM5 IJO in the morning, 2 phase in the afternoon and then reverse for the 2nd day.

SCORING "Each class will be scored separately (1 score from each level plus 1 other). The results from each separate class will be tallied to give the final team total."

Class 1 am 1st day TAM5 IJO Article 238 2.2
Class 2 pm 1st day 2 phase Table A Article 274 5.2
Class 3 am 2nd day - same as Class 2
Class 4 pm 2nd day - same as Class 1

A non-completed round (elimination, retirement or disqualification) = 0 Points.
A completed round with faults (any round – 1st round or jump offs) = 1 Point.
A completed clear 1st round = 2 Points.
A completed clear final jump off round = 5 Points, except that place-getters in each class, from 1st to 10th, gain points from 15 down to 6.

E.g. Points allocated 1st - 15 points down to 10th - 6 points.
Clear first round = 2 points.
Clear jump-off round = 5 points

TAM5/2 Phase: Unplaced double clear rounds finish on 7 points.

1st = 15 points plus 2 points for 1st clear round = 17 points,
2nd = 14 points plus 2 points for 1st clear round = 16 points,
and so on to...
10th = 6 points plus 2 points for 1st clear round = 8 points.

The equality rule suggested is - should equality exists in scores (to separate place getters):

- a) **Tally the number of clear rounds in the scores that count toward the final team total.**
If equality still exists then...
- b) **Tally the number of placings in the scores that count toward the final team total.**
In each case the highest tally would take the higher placing

- 6) Each competitor may ride only one horse or pony.
- 7) The 5 rally rule applies (i.e. 3 rallies on mount being entered and 5 in total).
- 8) Entry fee is set at \$140.00 per team--\$40.00 non refundable Nomination Fee & \$100.00 on confirmation of entry.
- 9) The host organizing committee reserves the right to limit if necessary the number of teams accepted & if necessary conduct a ballot, or add & make changes as they see fit.
- 10) Riders are permitted to ride up one age group.
- 11) A "Draft Rider" system will operate at this event, but riders must be available for their own branch first. The host committee will draw riders as required. Entry fee is \$30.00 per rider, \$10.00 non-refundable nomination fee & \$20.00 on confirmation of entry, \$20.00 refunded if placed in a team.

There is to be NO borrowing or short-term transfers (of less than 3 months) of riders from other Clubs/Branches or Areas, as the draft rider system is preferred.

Draft riders- are permitted to ride as individuals if they missed out on being placed in a team, unless a space becomes available in a team then the remaining riders will be redrawn.

Draft Riders must name 2 events in which they have COMPETED in the height in which they are to be entered.

- 12) Individual riders who are placed are to receive their rosettes but don't take points.
- 13) Dress—All teams are required to comply with the NZ Pony Club Formal Uniform, (i.e. shirt and tie) NZPCA Rule No.2:21. Also spur rule NZPCA Rule Book—Horse Trial 35 (g).
- 14) Scratchings to be notified to the event Secretary by 6pm on previous evening of the competition or sooner if possible & a Vet and/or Doctors certificate is required to be considered to receive an 80% refund of confirmation fee.
- 15) Changes are to be notified to the Event Secretary by 6pm the previous evening of the competition or sooner if possible. CHANGES are to be also cleared with the Area's District Commissioner and in writing or email to the secretary before the new rider/combination will be allowed to be entered.
- 16) The host, in conjunction with the guardians of the Competition have the right, where necessary to approve composite team/s for small branches/clubs within the areas of the South Island.
- 17) Each Teams Manager is responsible for their teams Gear Check and must sign the Managers Declaration Form prior to the commencement of the 1st Days Competition, and hand in when picking up their Manager's Pack.

REMITTS: Remits to the S.I.P.C.S.J. Champs must be submitted to the organising club/branch by close of nominations and that these remits are circulated to Clubs /Branches 2 months prior to the competition.

WARM UP Rules

- **Coaches / Managers** only are allowed in the warm up areas - please wear your name tag.
- Riders must wear Back Numbers at all times when mounted.
- Up to 6 riders (Maximum) are permitted in each warm up area and they must be accompanied by their coach or manager.
- Riders may only warm up over their age group practice fence.
- Practice fences may NOT be raised above age group heights.

A steward will be watching the warm up areas to make sure no team breaches rules or are mistreating any horse or pony.
